

WHAT DOES IT FEEL LIKE TO LIVE LIFE IN THE MOMENT?
HOW DO YOU DO IT?
WHAT ARE THE CONSEQUENCES?
WHAT MAKES IT SOMETIMES SEEM SO DIFFICULT?
WHAT ARE THE ESSENTIAL QUALITIES OF 'NOWNESS'?

This show is the second phase of the 'Stepping Stones to the Millennium" project. The first phase of this project took place last winter, 300 community members and fifty professionals collaborated to produce 'Prophecy', the biggest community project to ever take place in Wales. The third and fourth stages will see the company touring this type of large-scale production.

In 'Prophecy' we explored visions of the future from the past. Prophets throughout history were put on trial for predictions that we, at the end of the second millennium, face. The End of the World as we know it. "Now.Here" explores the present and how people might live their lives if there was definitely to be no tomorrow. No more feathering the nest egg, or saving for a rainy day. No more putting it off for tomorrow. How would we behave differently?

We've worked for months, created physical and emotional transformations, made wonders happen. All within no time. Until finally we all reach this point, this time in all our lives, which will not come again, this once in a lifetime opportunity, this "Now.Here".

MOFET STATE CERS

Established in 1985, NoFit State Circus were part of a renaissance of Circus that developed into the New Circus movement. They started as street performers, but soon developed into a touring Circus Theatre company. In 1991 a sponsorship deal with ASW bought them their first big top which has toured high quality and innovative shows across the length and breadth of the UK. The company has always been committed to passing their skills on to the community, and this work has developed from running circus workshops to initiating and producing massive community spectaculars such as last year's **Autogeddon** and **Prophecy**.

Here.now NoFit State Circus are once again pioneering a new field of performance. The work is a complete collaboration between existing medias, new technologies and live performers, and results in a unique and exciting new art form. More importantly this work is produced and devised by the company and the community for the community. By instigating workshops and collaborating with other community arts organisations and artists, NoFit State Circus give the people of South Wales an opportunity to learn new skills and develop their production and performance techniques and create high quality entertainments.

Next year will see the final stepping-stone to setting up a network of circus-based community arts activity throughout Wales. To achieve this it is proposed that a trilogy of this style of project be undertaken around Wales. Three locations would host the projects with involvement from a wide geographical, community and arts practice base.

NoFit State Circus plan to purchase a new custom-made big top and supporting equipment to use as a venue for these productions, and to tour the work developed during the Stepping-Stones project in their own "touring warehouse".

"Now,Here" began in September 1998. 12 weeks of workshops, on average 17 workshops each week, developed these six December performances. The workshops, led by professional artists (including Circus, Drama, Music, Dance Media, Visual Arts) involved a variety of communities and individuals including first time performers, visual artists, musicians and music makers, choirs, dance groups, drama groups, circus groups, installation and interactive artists, photographers, youth groups, schools and colleges. The range of choice enabled people of all abilities to get involved.

In addition to the Cardiff work we initiated satellite projects in Merthyr Tydfil, Swansea and Newport. These are creating artwork to be shown or performed locally which is integral to the Cardiff performances.

The groups researched, devised and created their own material within the theme. The core team developed a framework to integrate all ideas.

This "framework" included a script, set, staging, lighting, logistics, and a working timetable.

Gradually the groups came to work together, in a once empty warehouse, transformed into a performance venue with more equipment than seven standard theatres, and all the backstage support of any quality performance.

INTERACTIVE ARTISTS NEWPORT


Second year students from the Interactive Arts Department B.A. at University of Wales College Newport, have been involved in the project as part of their course. Responding to the themes of "Now.here" with computers, electronics, new technologies and their own creativity they have produced many of the installations in the labyrinth. Past graduates of UWCN have also taken this opportunity to demonstrate the skills learnt at the college to a wider public.

INTERACTIVE ARTISTS CARDIFF

Initiated by NoFit State, this group of artists have been meeting for the past few months generating ideas inspired by last year's show and the themes involved in "now.here". This has led to the creation of many interactive art pieces using cutting-edge technologies.

INTEGRATED MUSIC COMPANY

Voluntary community organisation, providing accessible quality musical experience for people with special needs, through workshops, opportunities to perform and by making available equipment. Funded by the Arts Council of Wales.





SPLOTT STATE CIRCUS

Set up in 1993 by NoFit State Circus as Cardiff's Performing Community Circus. This is their 8th project. Made up of a group of 12-55 year-old's from all walks of life, they share a common love of turning tricks in public. Many of its ex-members now work professionally in the field.

CIRCUS ERUPTION Swansea

The first ever integrated youth circus involving young people with special needs and abilities. Started in 1992 its fifty plus members have created their own show every year, and worked with No fit State to perform in front of thousands at Swansea's November the 5th firework spectacular.

CIRCUS ALL STARS

A group of visiting guest professionals who are so excited by the scale and style of this project that they are prepared to spend 3 weeks rehearsing in a cold warehouse. The group comprises some Circomedia Graduates, The Space Boyz, NoFit's own Ali and Lynn, as well as individuals from as far away as North Wales and Dublin.

PATUA DANCE

Patua was formed in 1993 and integrates people from many different backgrounds and nationalities. Our unique theatrical language tells stories through movement and takes performance out of the conventional and into unexpected places.

The Sherman Youth Theatre (SYT) provides a professional environment where interested young people can learn about many different aspects of theatre. Workshops are held weekly in the rehearsal spaces backstage at the Sherman Theatre. They provide a fun and informal way of learning where you are free to experiment and discover new skills . SYT offers many and diverse performance opportunities for its members. Recently we have produced several new plays, toured around Wales, performed street theatre and staged an exchange with an English company.

SHERMAN YOUTH THEATRE

THE UNDERDOGS

Are a voluntary youth group specialising in Hip-Hop culture, street dance, rap, DJ. skills, music production, information technology, graffiti/graphic design. Our workshop concentrates on "today" as youth see it with innocence and sex, bullying, theft, drugs and order.

CYFARTHFA HIGH SCHOOL

This workshop was designed to give children at Cyfathfa High School, the opportunity to use a commercial computer Design Package and to develop their computer skills. The potential that is provided by the aim of creating a piece of art for public display is enormous. This is particularly apparent in terms of confidence and a wider understanding of the role of art within society and other disciplines.

WELSH SIKH TIGERS

A Cardiff Warehouse project, the Welsh Sikh Tigers meet once a week to explore folk dances from the Punjab.



SWICA

Rudi-mental; ritualistic Afro-Brazilian drumming. Going back to roots which continue to influence, we give you music for ceremony and celebration. Music to invoke the spirits. Rhythms for trance and vodoo dance. Syncopate your spirit and groove with the Gods.

COMMUNITY MUSIC WALES

Aims to provide music-making opportunities for people who, due to social disadvantage, might not otherwise be involved. This includes physically or learning disabled people, socially excluded or discouraged young people, people with mental health problems, older people and people from disadvantaged areas.

Our work takes a variety of forms - from rock school projects, community music tutor training for professional musicians, workshops for learning or physically disabled people, through to live community performances, and work with a wide network of musicians and community artists.

WELSH COLLEGE OF MUSIC AND DRAMA

This year the student group have undertaken several different areas of movement research and through a process of improvisation and selection, have arrived at what we show tonight. The themes we have explored include 'the body as corpse' 'breaking up the syntax of movement' 'scratching the body' and 'time' motifs.

UNIVERSITY OF GLAMORGAN

This project has given students from the College the opportunity to work alongside community groups and professional artists on a more public platform than is usually available. The educational benefits of this experience are manifold.



EXPERIMENTAL DANCE GROUP

The Spice of Cardiff's community members experimenting with dance and movement, creating their own fleshy picture of pleasure and pain, the seethrough machine, the game of time, instinct versus logic - a head-on collision.

NEW COMMUNITY VOICES

A new departure for NoFit State community show; a community voice workshop. Working together to make the kinds of sounds we usually only dream about making... "and then everyone joined in"




